Raising the Bar in the Face of Challenges





Orbis Canada was very pleased to participate in the Colour of Joy program organized by PACE in partnership with Radio Metro Mail. We really enjoyed hearing the children and teens speak about their impressions of Canada. Everyone was welcoming - and the food was great! Additionally, Orbis Canada was thrilled to welcome our first team to represent the Bangladeshi community, "Team Bengal Tiger", powered by PACE and RMM, at the 9th Annual Plane Pull for Sight on May 28, 2017. The team not only competed against other teams to pull a 60-tonne airplane, they raised funds that will partially fund the Orbis Flying Eye Hospital scheduled to be in Chittagong in November 2017. Plane Pull for Sight raises funds to prevent and treat avoidable blindness in developing countries. Orbis looks forward to working with PACE and RMM as a partner in raising funds and awareness to help eradicate avoidable blindness in children and adults in developing nations.

ORBIS Partnership and Community Awareness to Prevent Child Blindness

For the first time in the history of ORBIS Canada, a team consisting of Bangladeshi Canadians participated in the Plane Pull event, the annual fundraising event of ORBIS Canada. The 'Team Bengal Tiger' led by PACE partially contributed in raising CAN\$ 158,000 in 2017. The amount would help ORBIS to prevent child blindness amongst poor children in the developing countries including Bangladesh. PACE jointly with the RMM through a single event raised CAN\$ 2,000 from the community for the event in 2017.

PACE also launched a month-long social campaign on Radio Metro Mail to create greater awareness in the community on issues related to eye care and how the community can help prevent child blindness in the developing countries. A number of world-class ophthalmologist from Canada and Bangladesh took part in the radio program.









Partnership in Theatre

Theatre and Playwriting Workshop

With a view to inspiring new theatre and playwriting enthusiasts from within the community, a 5-day interactive theatre workshop was organized in July 2016. Representatives from community theatre groups participated in the initiative. Masum Reza, a UK based renowned theatre activist, popular TV scriptwriter and Bangla Academy Award winner playwright along with two more resource persons from UK conducted the workshop. The workshop was organized by PACE in partnership with Theatre Folks UK, Theatre Folks Toronto, Radio Metro Mail and MAK Entertainment.

PACE in partnership with Theatre Folks Toronto plans to stage English plays on social issues, written by community playwrights. The performances will be showcased in different cities in North America.


Enter Educate Drama
